

# Claudia Sanders Dinner House



In 1959, at the age of 69, Colonel Harland Sanders and his wife, Claudia, moved from Southeastern Kentucky to Shelbyville and established the Claudia Sanders Dinner House. The one hundred twenty five year old dwelling, Blackwood Hall, which is adjacent to the Dinner House, served as the Sanders' residence and the base of operation for Kentucky Fried Chicken after their move here. Later, a larger building was added and became what we know today as the Dinner House.

Their knowledge of Southern Recipes and their natural leaning toward the restaurant business soon brought about the creation of this, the Claudia Sanders Dinner House where an air of Southern Hospitality and cooking combined with old fashioned, family style service still remain.
